



Day 1: Delhi Stay at:- Metropolitan, Delhi

Upon arrival, after clearing immigration and custom's, you will be met and transferred to your hotel.




Day 2: Delhi

Stay at: - Metropolitan, Delhi

Following breakfast, city sightseeing of Delhi Moming, visit New Delhi: Includes visits to such sights as Humayun's Tomb (1586) and the Qutab Minar 72 meters high and one of the most perfect towers in the Persian world. The Iron Pillar which has survived the vagaries of weather for over 1500 years. Continue with a drive through Embassy area, the Government buildings (1921-1930) and other places of interest. Afternoon, visit Old Delhi: An ancient walled city. Here you will drive past Red Fort, the most opulent Fort and Palace of the Mughal Empire: Raj Ghat, the memorial site of the Mahatma Gandhi; Jama Masjid, the largest mosque in India; and Chandni Chowk, the bustling and colourful market of the old city.






Day 3: Delhi - Jaipur




Day 4: Jaipur

Morning, visit to Amber Fort, Amber Fort: A marvelous example of Rajput architecture with its terraces and ramparts reflected in the Maota Lake below. The ascent to the fort is on gaily caparisoned elephants or by jeep. Afternoon, visit Jaipur City: - Palace of the Winds, a five-storied structure of pink sandstone with semi-octagonal and delicately honeycombed windows overlooking the main street of the old city. Also Visit City Palace & Observatory. The City Palace in the heart of the old city is a blend of Rajasthani and Mughal architecture. The center of the palace is a seven-storied building called Chandra Palace, with fine views over the gardens and the city. Next stop the City Palace is the Solar Observatory - an astronomical treasure house, with solar device that gives accurate predictions till date.






Day 5: Jaipur - Fatehpur Sikri - Agra


Stay at:- ITC Mughal, Agra

Following breakfast, drive to Agra en-route visit Fatehpur Sikri: A fascinating ghost town, lies a little beyond Agra the deserted Red sandstone city that was built by Emperor Akbar as his capital. Set like a jewel in a courtyard of pink sandstone is the marble tomb of the Saint Salim Chisti, enclosed by delicately carved marble screens.

After visit, continue your drive to Agra.

Upon arrival, check in to your hotel. Evening free for leisure activities.







Day 6: Agra

Stay at:- ITC Mughal, Agra

Following breakfast, full day visit Agra Morning visit Taj Mahal: Agra is the city of the Taj Mahal, perhaps the most photographed monument in the world. However, no matter how many pictures you have seen or no matter how high your expectations are, the Taj never lets you down - the unparalleled glory and beauty of the building surpasses beyond all human imaginations. Spectacular monument built for love. Besides perfect symmetry in every aspect of its construction, the inlay work of semi precious stones into marble in pietra dura style is absolutely remarkable. (Taj Mahal Closed on Fridays)

Afternoon visit Agra City: Agra is not only famous for Taj Mahal but the impressive Mughal Red Fort known as the Agra Fort. The story of the Mughal Empire in stone. Built by Emperor Akbar and successively enriched with places and marble pavilions.





Day 7: Agra - Jhansi - Orchha


Stay at:- Orchha Resort, Orchha

Following breakfast, transfer to Railway station for train to Jhansi.

Upon arrival, you will be met and drive to Orchha & check in to your hotel.

Afternoon, visit Orchha: The Bundela chief Raja Rudra Pratap (1501-31) chose an easily defended and beautiful site for his capital. Set on the island on a bend in the Betwa River, it is elevated above the surrounding wooded countryside. Once capital of its own state, Orchha contains three palaces - The Raj Mahal, Rai Parveen Mahal, Jahangir Mahal - each built by succeeding Maharajas in a similar style and combining to form a complex as imposing as that at Udaipur. Also visit Ram Raja Temple & Chaturbhuj Temple.





Day 8: Orchha - Khajuraho


Stay at:- Radisson, Khajuraho

Following breakfast, drive to Khajuraho.

Upon arrival, check in to your hotel.

Afternoon, city sightseeing of Khajuraho City: The Eastern and Western Group Temples Founded in the 9th and 10th Century by the rulers of Chandela Dynasty, influenced by tantrism, in eroticism becomes a theme of philosophical interest and the aim is submlimation of sexual relationship in the sexual act or "Maithun", women being regarded as the incarnation of the divine energy or "Shakti". It is also possible that the Khajuraho were influenced by "Kama Sutra". Among the temples to visit is the Kandariya Mahadeo, Chaunsat Yogini, Chitragupta temple, adinath Temples, Vishwanath temple, andvarious other temples.






Day 9: Khajuraho - Varanasi


Stay at: - Taj Gateway, Varanasi

Following breakfast, in time transfer to airport for your flight to Varanasi

Upon arrival, you will be transferred to your hotel.

Afternoon excursion Sarnath: 10 kms from the centre of the city, Sarnath symbolises the birth of Buddhism. It was here that Lord Buddha revealed his doctrine and founded his monastic community. The Museum at Sarnath is amongst the most important in India and contains carvings representing a whole range of styles - Archaic, the covering work of sculptors from 3rd century B.C. to the 12th century A.D.






Day 10: Varanasi


Stay at: - Taj Gateway, Varanasi

Early morning proceed for boat ride at Sunrise on the Mother Ganges River. This is a soul stirring experience as you witness the performance of various rituals, laundary & cremations in the background of the rising Sun. We also have an opportunity to walk the narrow streets which are preserved as they were 100s of years back in time. Following your visit, you realise why Varanasi is described as the 'etemal city!.

Later visit Varanasi City: The consists of visiting the city temples – the durga temple, better known as the Monkey temple on account of the large number of monkeys residing there and the temple of Vishwanath (or Vesheshwar "Lord of the Universe") are the most sacred spots in the city. Visit will also include Bharat Mata or Mother India Temple and the Benares Hindu University.

Rest of the day at leisure. Overnight at hotel.





Day 11: Varanasi - Kathmandu









Day 12: Kathmandu

Stay at: - Soaltee Crowne Plaza, Kathmandu

Following breakfast, excursion to Nagarkot: Located 32 kilometers east of Kathmandu, is one of the most scenic spots in Bhaktapur district and is renowned for its spectacular sunrise view of the Himalaya when the weather is clear. Nagarkot has become famous as one of the best spots to view Mount Everest as well as other snow-topped peaks of the Himalayan range of eastern Nepal. Bhaktapur: Bhaktapur is the third largest city in the Kathmandu valley. The city was once the capital of Nepal during the great Malla Kingdom from the 12th to the 15th century. Four square miles of land situated at an altitude of 1,401 meter from sea-level is a home to Traditional art and architecture, pottery and weaving industries, rich local customs and culture, and the every-day life of Bhaktapur people. Evening visit to Changu Narayan.





Day 13: Kathmandu – Pashupatinath – Bodhnath – Kathmandu

Stay at: - Soaltee Crowne Plaza, Kathmandu

Full day visit Pashupatinath & Bodhnath. Following breakfast morning visit Kathmandu City: The temple of lord Shiva - Pashupatinath is a richly ornamented pagoda with two tiered golden roof and silver doors. Pashupatinath: Situated five kilometers east of Kathmandu on the bank of sacred Bagmati river. It is a center of annual pilgrimage on the day of Maha Shivratri. Entrance to the temple precinct is permitted to the Hindus only.

Also visit other temples around Pashupatinath like, Guheswari Temple, Akash Bhairav Temple in Indra Chowk. however, visitors can clearly see the temple and activities performed in the temple premises from the eastern bank of the Bagmati river. Bodhnath: The stupa of Bodhnath lies eight kilometers east of Kathmandu. This colossal and ancient stupa, one of the biggest in the world has the all-seeing eyes of Lord Buddha. It was built by Lichchhavi king Mana Dev in the fifth century A.D. it is built on an octagonal base inset with prayer wheels. Overnight at hotel








Morning Free In time, transfer to airport for your flight to Delhi. Upon arrival, you will be met and transferred to International Airport.

Visa Formalities /Information

- Foreign nationals wishing to travel to India are required to possess a valid passport of their country and a valid Indian visa. However, nationals of Nepal and Bhutan do not require visa to enter India and nationals of Maldives do not require visa for entry in India for a period up to 90 days (a separate visa regime exists for diplomatic/official passport holders).
- The Consular Passport and Visa (CPV) Division of the Ministry of External Affairs is responsible for issuing Indian visas to foreign nationals for their visit for various purposes. This facility is granted through various Indian missions abroad.
- Visa fees are non-refundable and subject to change without notice. The Embassy / High Commission/Consulate reserves the right on granting and deciding the type/duration of visa irrespective of the fees tendered at the time of making the application.
- Visa on arrival facility is limited to the below listed nationalities.
- Only for citizens of Finland , Luxembourg, Singapore, New Zealand, Japan, Cambodia, Laos, Vietnam, Philippines, Indonesia and Myanmar.
