#### Day 3: Jaipur


Stay at:- Rambagh Palace, Jaipur


### Day 4: Jaipur

Stay at: - The Oberoi Udaivilas, Udaipur


Today before taking the flight to Udaipur, enjoy the blissful ambience of the hotel. Post lunch transfer to the airport to take flight to Udaipur.






#### Day 6: Udaipur

The first stop is the majestic city palace. City palace is a complete white structure, standing majestically on a hill and the largest palace complex of Rajasthan. There are series of courtyards overlapping pavilion of terraces, corridors and hanging gardens. There is the Suraj Gokhada, the balcony of the Sun, where the Suryawanshi (sons of the Sun God); Maharanas of Mewar, presented themselves in times of trouble to the people to restore their confidence. The Mor chowk or the peacock courtyard gets its name from the glass decoration it has. The chini chitrashala is noteworthy for its blue and white ceramics, while a series of wall paintings on Lord Krishna are on display





#### Day 7: Jodhpur


Stay at: - Umaid Bhawan Palace, Jodhpur

From Pink to White and now to the Blue city, Jodhpur, the central point of the state of Rajasthan is known as Blue city and the city of sunshine, for round the year sunshine!

Morning post breakfast, transfer to Jodhpur by road. All through one can see mostly arid vegetation and dry land. THEN a Maruthal or land of death came to life when Rathores of Kanauj moved in, but the city was actually founded by Rao Jodhaji in 1459 A.D. He was the chief of the Rathore clan of Rajputs who claimed to be the descendant of Rama, the epic hero of Ramayana, and NOW it is a city bustling with life and pomp.

Upon arrival transfer to the hotel Umaid Bhawan palace and help yourself to Lunch. THEN built as a Palace built for Maharaja





#### Day 8: Neemrana



### Day 9: Delhi Departure

Move on to visit Raj Ghat which is the "Samadhi" of the father of the nation who preached non violence throughout his life. Later drive pass the India Gate is the enormous arch built in the memory of the innumerous soldiers who attained martyrdom during the First World War. Bang opposite on the Raj path, stands the majestic President's house or the Rashtrapati Bhawan. Adjacent to it is the parliament house or the Sansad Bhawan, the seat of Indian



#### General guidelines while Traveling to Indian subcontinent

#### Visa Formalities /Information

- Foreign nationals wishing to travel to India are required to possess a valid passport of their country and a valid Indian visa. However, nationals of Nepal and Bhutan do not require visa to enter India and nationals of Maldives do not require visa for entry in India for a period up to 90 days (a separate visa regime exists for diplomatic/official passport holders).
- The Consular Passport and Visa (CPV) Division of the Ministry of External Affairs is responsible for issuing Indian visas to foreign nationals for their visit for various purposes. This facility is granted through various Indian missions abroad
- Visa fees are non-refundable and subject to change without notice. The Embassy / High Commission/Consulate reserves the right on granting and deciding the type/duration of visa irrespective of the fees tendered at the time of making the application.
- Visa on arrival facility is limited to the below listed nationalities.
- Only for citizens of Finland , Luxembourg, Singapore, New Zealand, Japan, Cambodia, Laos, Vietnam, Philippines, Indonesia and Myanmar.
